THE SCHOOL RULES

Pupils are expected to behave in such a manner as to maintain the good reputation of Stockport Grammar School, showing courtesy and consideration to other people at all times. Unruly conduct in public, inappropriate use of electronic communication systems or any offence against the law will be considered a serious breach of this tenet.

- ATTENDANCE** Pupils are expected to be punctual and to attend all teaching and private-study sessions. Pupils are expected to participate in all organised games and Physical Education. Pupils too late for registration must sign in at Reception immediately on arrival. Repeated lateness will attract a detention. Lateness is defined as arriving too late to be registered by the Form Tutor.
- ABSENCE** Leave of absence is obtainable only from the Headmaster and is not automatic. Requests should be written wherever possible well in advance. Pupils must not leave the School premises between 8.40 a.m. and 3.50 p.m. for any reason without the permission of the Headmaster or the Proctor, or the Head of Upper School in the case of Sixth Form exeats. Medical appointment cards must be shown to the Form Tutor at least one day in advance of the appointment and they or exeat cards should be shown to the gatekeeper as pupils leave the premises, prior to which pupils must sign out at Reception.
- ILLNESS** After every absence pupils must hand a signed parental note to their Form Tutor at morning registration which clearly states the date(s) of absence and reason for the absence. If feeling unwell at School, pupils must inform their current or next subject teacher before reporting to the School Nurse. They must not phone home before seeing the Nurse.
- TIMES** Morning School begins with registration at 8.40 a.m. Unless supervised by a teacher, pupils must either leave the premises by 4.15 p.m. or work in the Library which is open until 5.30 p.m. All pupils must leave the School premises by 6.00 p.m.
- LUNCH** All pupils are to have School lunch. Food must not be removed from the Dining Hall.
- PERSONAL SAFETY** The safety of every individual is of paramount importance. For that reason pupils must not under any circumstances climb on walls, fences or roofs or through any windows. All car parks, cellars, maintenance and grounds department workshops together with caretakers' and cleaners' stores are permanently out of bounds. The Sixth Form Common Rooms are for Sixth Form use only. Unauthorised use of School equipment is not permitted.
- PERSONAL PROPERTY** All property must be clearly named. Pupils must not bring to School valuable items or sums of money in excess of requirements for transport or for limited personal expenditure within School. During games, physical education periods and when playing for School teams valuables must be deposited as instructed by the staff. Radios and personal music systems must not be brought to School. Mobile telephones are permitted but must be switched off during the School day. They must not be used for communication, musical retrieval or photography. The School has no insurance for personal property and will accept no responsibility for the loss, damage or theft of such items.
- DEPORTMENT** Noisy and unruly behaviour in the School is forbidden. Chewing gum is banned from the School premises. Pupils should not eat during the School day except at break and lunch times – and then not in corridors.
- DRESS** All pupils must wear the School uniform in accordance with the published list. Hair styles should be conventional and of a reasonable length. A neat appearance is expected at all times.
- JEWELLERY** Watches and official School badges may be worn but all other forms of jewellery and badges are prohibited, although girls may wear one stud in each ear.
- COSMETICS** Pupils are not permitted to wear any form of make-up or nail varnish when in School uniform.
- LITTER** All litter should be deposited in the bins provided.
- CYCLES** All cycles must be left securely locked in the designated areas. Pupils must not cycle on footpaths within School or in any areas where pedestrians may be placed at risk.
- MOTOR CYCLES** Pupils may not bring motor cycles or scooters into the School grounds at any time.
- CARS** Pupils who have passed the driving test may drive to and from School provided that they have their parents' permission. Parking in the neighbouring roads should be within the requirements of the law and must not inconvenience residents or members of the public. Pupils are not permitted to drive onto the premises on a School day unless a parking permit has been obtained and can be displayed.
- SMOKING** Smoking while wearing School uniform or while on School premises is forbidden. Pupils must not have in their possession cigarettes, matches, tobacco or lighters.
- DRINKING** Pupils are not permitted to drink alcohol, or to be in possession of alcohol, on the way to, from or in School.
- DANGEROUS ITEMS** Pupils must not have in their possession any drugs, weapons, aerosol sprays, chemicals, fireworks or other items which the School considers dangerous.
- TRANSACTIONS** Pupils must not buy, sell or barter goods. Gambling is forbidden.
- SCHOOL TRIPS/ACTIVITIES** Pupils must behave in accordance with the rules, requirements and reputation of the School. The general rules of behaviour apply for all School trips and activities, but variations from the rules for specific circumstances will be published when trips/activities are being offered.

These rules may be amended from time to time, and shall apply so long as a pupil remains at the School, irrespective of his or her age. Breach of the aforementioned School Rules may result in suspension, either temporary or permanent. In the interpretation of these School Rules the Headmaster's decision shall be final.
