What maths qualifications do I need?

$$\hat{H}(q) = \sum_{i=1}^N -\frac{1}{2} \nabla_i^2 - \int \frac{q(R)}{\|r_i - R\|} dR + \sum_{i < j} \frac{1}{r_{ij}}$$

No doubt that competency in maths and use of number is an advantage.

A level maths not required but is useful.

New mathematical skills taught in chemistry lessons

$$q_{X_{min}}(R) = \sum_{j=1} q_j \delta^3(R - R_j)$$

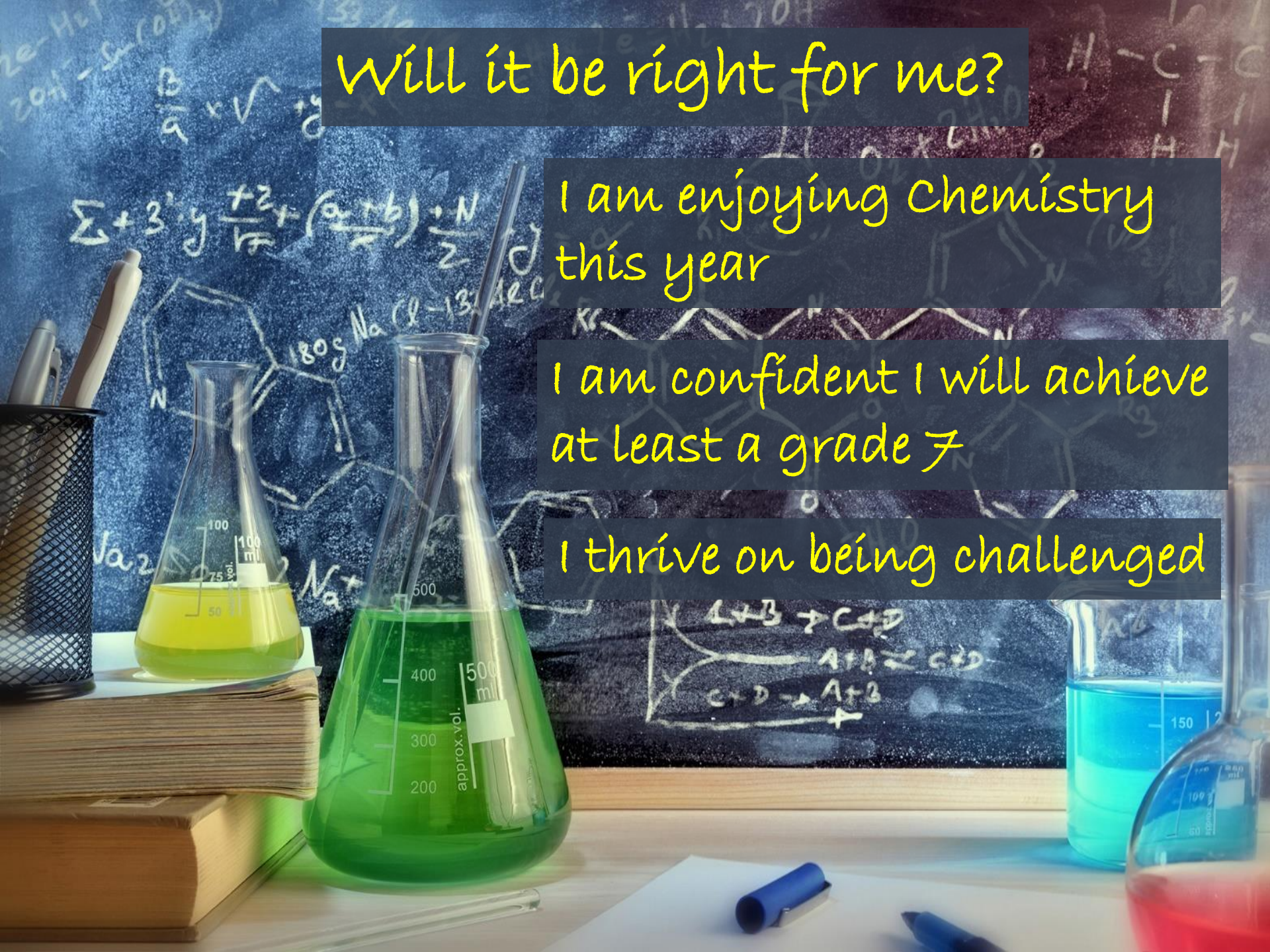


Will it be right for me?
