

The activities on offer are designed to be enjoyable and to challenge pupils' physical abilities. We also aim to provide as many as possible with the opportunity to represent the school.

In addition to specialist staff, the department is supported by over twenty sports coaches and academic staff who run and coach school teams.

Our purpose-built sports centre contains a sports hall with climbing wall and extensive changing areas. We also have a fully equipped gymnasium, a squash court, a 25m swimming pool, five netball courts (seven tennis courts in summer), an all-weather pitch (eight tennis courts in summer), four artificial cricket nets, numerous grass pitches and a fitness room including a nine station multi-gym.

Physical Education is offered at GCSE and Sports Science at A Level.

A Summer Term Induction Day brings children together to explore SGS and to get to know their Form Tutors and classmates before the start of school in September. A few weeks into the Autumn Term all the pupils take part in a two-day adventure to Ilam Hall Youth Hostel in Derbyshire. Ilam Hall provides a picturesque and comfor base from which to explore the area and undertake spee designed tasks focused on teamwork, new friendships a confidence building. Post-examination meeting

An informal meeting forms the final stage of the admissions procedure. Those invited for a post-examination meeting will be notified by email within two weeks of the entrance exam. You and your child will meet with a member of the senior management team.

Offer of a place

The letter will say if your child has been offered a place. If you have applied for financial assistance, the letter will also say if the place has been offered with assistance.

You will be given the opportunity to visit the school again after places have been offered.

SCHOOL LIFE

School Hours

Senior School morning registration is at 8.40am but pupils may arrive from 7.45am when the school site opens. The Library opens at 8am and breakfast is available to purchase in the Dining Hall. There are 5 periods of lessons per day, with lessons alternating on a two week Blue Week/ Yellow Week timetable. Lunch is from 12.30pm to 1.50pm to allow plenty of time to eat, take a break and enjoy co-curricular activities. The school day ends at 3.50pm but the school site remains open to pupils to 6pm so they can take part in further co-curricular activities and use the school library and other study spaces.

Meals

We are committed to ensuring our pupils are provided with nutritious, appetising and wholesome meals to aid their creativity, energy and concentration throughout the school day. We provide a comprehensive menu offering a range of healthy meals to satisfy all requirements and palates. Please let us know if your child has a food allergy or a special dietary requirement.

We have an extensive network of private school buses.


Public buses stopping outside school

Trains

FEES AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE



School fees cover the cost of tuition, examination entries, textbooks, most co-curricular activities and the Senior School First Year residential trip. Parents are not asked to purchase IT equipment for use in school.

Bursaries

Shaa scholarships

We offer a small number of scholarships each year based on outstanding performance in the entrance examination. A Shaa scholarship gives a reduction of £1,000 on each full year's fees and is held for the pupil's first five years in the senior school, subject to an annual progress review. You do not need to apply for a Shaa scholarship and they are not subject to a means test. Offers of Shaa scholarships will be made in the letter sent to parents in March giving the outcome of the entrance examination.

Music scholarships

Two music scholarships are available each year to cover up to 25% of the school fees. Music scholarships are awarded after audition to prospective pupils who have already reached a high standard on one or more instruments and show outstanding musical potential.
