DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

SGS is proud to be one of the largest Direct Licensed Organisations for the Duke of Edinburgh Award in the North West with over 80% of our Third Year starting the Bronze Award each year and many seeing it through to Gold in Sixth Form.

Our in-house DofE Coordinator works closely with pupils to ensure each participant's programme is tailor made to reflect the individual's starting point, abilities and interests.

Incorporating four sections at Bronze and Silver level – physical, skill, volunteering and expedition – with an extra section of residential available at Gold level.

DofE is completed alongside school studies and can include existing activities undertaken outside the curriculum. The award is beneficial to pupils on various levels, giving young people opportunities to try new activities, develop self-confidence and improve team work skills whilst working to obtain a recognised qualification that is highly valued by universities and employers.

From walking to voluntary work, canoeing to mountain biking, there is a vast array of activities that can be undertaken during the award scheme. The aim is to challenge yourself, have fun and gain skills and experiences that will last a lifetime.
